

Jammin' with MID-LIFE CRISIS



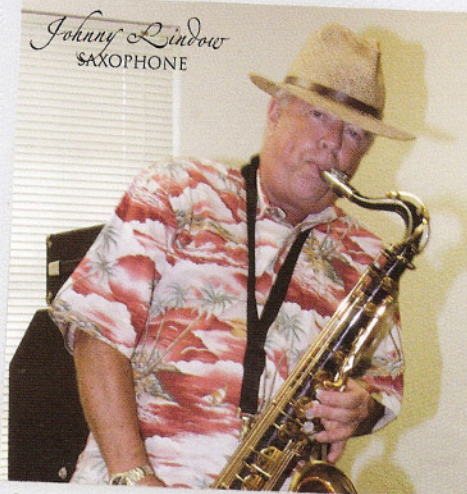

We kicked around some different names, but this one seemed to fit what we were doing and the time in our lives that we were doing it," Frank Oberle explains. The group started out with Judge Mickey Shuffield, David Perkins and Oberle. They quickly found a top-notch lead singer in Fred Schwartz. After a few practices, the guys decided if they want to play classic rock and roll and rhythm and blues –

they needed more instruments. So, next came talented bass player Brett Vickers and then keyboard master, Antoine Leblanc, who played in the popular band "The Kidz" in his younger days. The next music man to join the "band of baby-boomers" was Johnny Lindow. The spirited sax player was a barber in his day job, cutting Frank Oberle's hair for 20+ years. The cool crooners knew they had a good thing because their personalities just seem to jive. They practiced once a week at The Acura Dealership that Fred managed. Friends and family kept begging them to let them hear their sound. After six months, the band finally gave in and threw a small private party to break out Mid-Life Crisis to a live audience. The first song they played was "Gloria" by Van Morrison. The 200 guests quickly filled up the dance floor, staying on their feet the rest of the evening. Soon the news of their talents spread thru the West End. In 2003, The

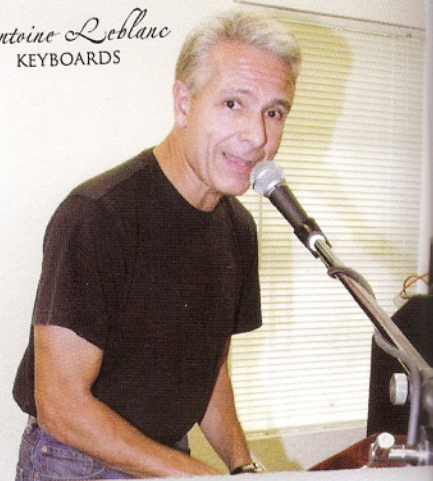

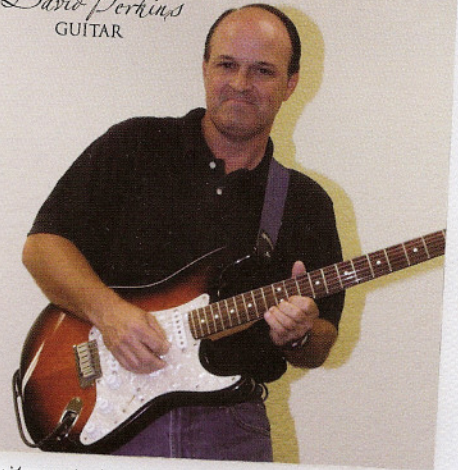

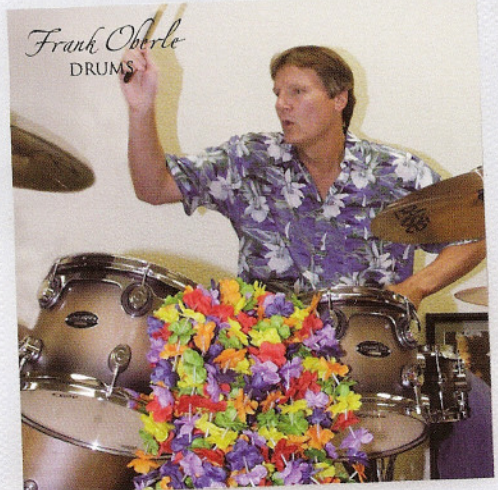
Logon Café booked the band for their first paying gig. "They were taking a chance on us because they had never heard us and we did not have a demo tape. The place was packed, and again, everyone had a blast. We started playing there on a regular basis after that," says Oberle. In 2005 Brett Vickers decided to retire from playing music and the guys started searching for a bass player. Luckily super skilled, Doc Bradford agreed to attend a jam session and was instantly hooked. After playing private parties and some club gigs, the band wanted to add another dimension to their sound. The guys agreed a female lead vocalist would kick it up a notch. And then came Jennifer Parker...the small gal with the incredibly big voice. This chick can sing! Finally, Mid-Life Crisis was complete. The band's popularity and fan base grew with every party they played. To date they have played many memorable events. Frank shares, "We played the main stage at Mardi Gras in Port Arthur in 2005 on Saturday night right before the biggest parade of the weekend. There were many thousands in the crowd and it was exciting to be there." The list goes on to include a regular gig for A Tasting for Some Other Place, Brent Coon's Annual Christmas Party and even an impromptu jam session with Tracy Byrd. "He was in the audience at one of our parties and came on stage to play with us. Most people only hear him do country but he can also play some excellent rock and roll," states the numbers man. But the guys and gal agree, what keeps Mid-Life Crisis fans requesting more is their comedic interaction with the crowd and the classic tunes that work for all ages. 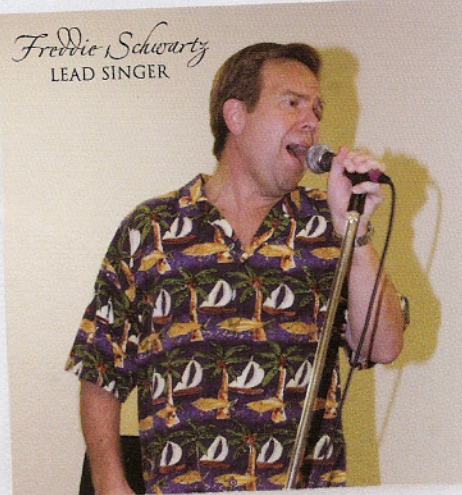

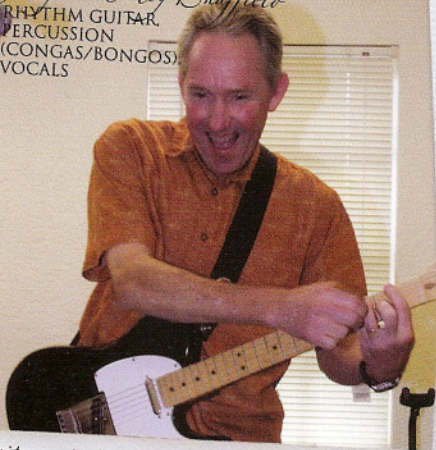

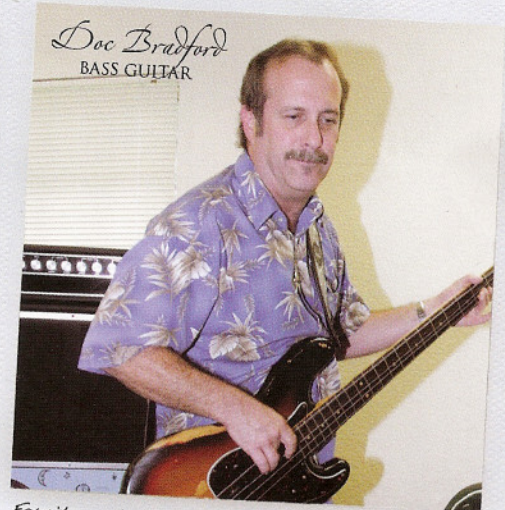
